

The Big Beautiful Bill

Recently, the President signed into law the “One, Big, Beautiful Bill,” a funding package that includes the long-debated defunding of Planned Parenthood and other abortion providers. While headlines swirl and fear-based rhetoric rises, it’s important that our community understands one thing clearly: women are not being abandoned—they’re being offered better options.

The notion that Planned Parenthood is the only healthcare provider for women is simply false. In fact, there are over 12,000 Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) across the United States that offer comprehensive, low-cost or free healthcare, including prenatal care, cancer screenings, and well-woman visits. These centers vastly outnumber Planned Parenthood clinics and serve women regardless of their ability to pay.

In addition to FQHCs, pregnancy help organizations like ours offer compassionate, no-cost care and practical support to women facing unexpected pregnancies. Our mission is to walk alongside women, not profit from their fears. We offer pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, parenting education, material assistance, and referrals for medical and housing needs—all at no charge.

This bill is not about restricting access to care—it’s about redirecting taxpayer dollars away from abortion providers and into healthcare providers that don’t rely on ending life as a business model. And it’s a call to action for local communities to step up and ensure that no woman ever feels alone in her pregnancy.

Our doors are open, and we are ready. We invite our neighbors, churches, medical professionals, and local leaders to stand with us. Together, we can build a community where women are supported, children are welcomed, and life is celebrated.

Key Facts About the "One, Big, Beautiful Bill"

The President has signed into law the "One, Big, Beautiful Bill" that redirects federal funding away from abortion providers like Planned Parenthood.

The intent is to invest in healthcare providers that serve women without offering abortion, such as Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) and pregnancy help organizations.

1. **Women Are Not Left Without Care.**

The defunding of Planned Parenthood does not mean women are left with no place to turn. There are over 12,000 Federally Qualified Health Centers

(FQHCs)^[1] across the country^[2]—offering comprehensive women’s healthcare services—in addition to the 3,000+ pregnancy help organizations^[3] ready to walk with women through unexpected pregnancies with compassion and support.

2. **Life-Affirming Help Is Available Nationwide.**

Pregnancy help organizations provide **free, practical services**^[4]—including pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, parenting classes, maternity housing, and material assistance—ensuring women receive the support they need to thrive during and after pregnancy.

3. **Community-Based Care Is Growing.**

The network of pregnancy help^[5] is expanding because communities care deeply about women and their children. Unlike abortion providers, pregnancy help centers focus on the whole woman—physically, emotionally, and spiritually—offering resources^[6] without pressure or profit motives.

4. **Redirecting Funds to True Healthcare.**

This bill reorients funding toward healthcare providers^[7] that do not profit from abortion, allowing tax dollars to support real, comprehensive care for women and families—especially in underserved and rural areas^[8].

5. **We Stand Ready to Help.**

The pregnancy help movement has been preparing for this moment. We are ready to receive more women^[9] ^[10] seeking help, hope, and alternatives to abortion. Every woman deserves to be empowered with support—not sold a procedure.
